Dream Big Homeschool: A Journey Through Time: April Curriculum (Ages 2-12)

I. Supplies:

- **Art Supplies:** Construction paper (various colors), cardboard, paper plates, paint, markers, crayons, glue, scissors, clay, string, beads, fabric scraps.
- Writing Supplies: Paper, pencils, pens, notebooks, journals, index cards, poster board.
- **Books:** Age-appropriate books about historical events, figures, and civilizations.

- Week 1: Ancient Civilizations
- Week 2: The Middle Ages
- Week 3: The Age of Exploration and Discovery
- Week 4: The 20th and 21st Centuries

III. Daily Activities:

Week 1: Ancient Civilizations

- Monday: Introduction to Ancient Civilizations
 - · (2-5):

- Activity 1: "Let's Dress Up!" Dress up in simple costumes to represent ancient people (e.g., togas, pharaoh headdresses).
- Activity 2: "Sand Play." Play in a sandbox and build simple structures like pyramids.

· (6-9):

- Activity 1: "What is a Civilization?" Discuss the characteristics of a civilization (e.g., organized government, cities, writing).
- Activity 2: "Timeline Creation." Create a basic timeline of ancient civilizations (e.g., Mesopotamia, Egypt, Greece, Rome).

- Activity 1: "Chinese Inventions." Learn about Chinese inventions (e.g., paper, compass, gunpowder).

· (10-12):
